Fees or co-payments for services are based on clients' income level and may also be determined by government funded programs such as Home and Community Care (HACC), Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP).

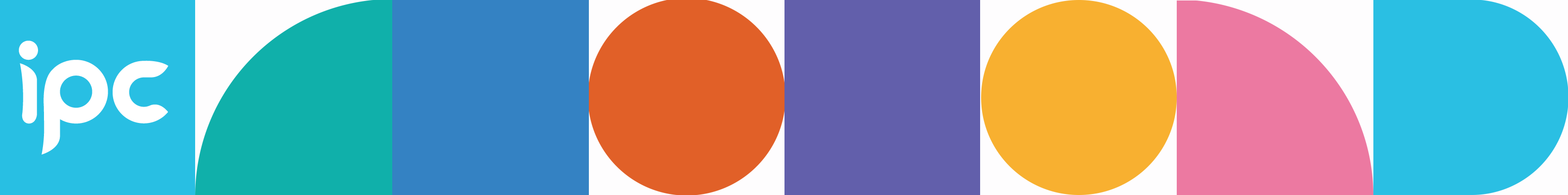
Fees and co-payments are based on the Centrelink standards for low, medium and high incomes and are discussed with clients at the time of making an appointment or going onto a waiting list.

We have kept co-contribution fees the same since 2018, absorbing the 2019 price recommendation due to the impact of the pandemic on our clients.

From 15 May 2023, our fees will increase in line with the 2019 recommendation as set by our funding bodies.
