# What do paediatric occupational therapists do?

Paediatric (child) occupational therapists work with families to help children join in daily activities such as:

### **Self-care**

- dressing and washing
- using spoons, knives and forks
- trying different foods
- going to the toilet
- going to sleep

### **Productivity**

- drawing, writing, colouring, cutting, painting, threading and craft
- sitting on chairs and on the mat
- paying attention and concentrating
- following instructions
- going to the shops

## **Play**

- using playground equipment
- riding a bike
- climbing
- group games
- making friends
- using different types of toys
- using building blocks
- using the sandpit
- ball games



# How can a paediatric occupational therapist help?

They work with you and your child in the following ways:

- provide assessments and reports
- one-on-one therapy sessions
- group and home programs
- visits to kindergarten or child care
- follow-up phone calls
- provide information and ideas to other people working with your child
