

Older Australians

The Australian Government service My Aged Care provides people aged over 65 years and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people 50 years and over, as well as people experiencing or at risk of homelessness aged care services and programs.

If you would like help staying at home, you can apply through My Aged Care for a Home Care Package. A package gives you more control over the services you receive at home.

You can also organise services such as physiotherapy, podiatry, occupational therapy, dietetics and speech therapy through My Aged Care.

IPC Health is a registered provider with My Aged Care, so you can ask for IPC Health to be your preferred service provider.
